Sermon on the Mount Course

The Sermon on the Mount (Matthew chapters 5 to 7) is The Great Charter of Christianity. Jesus hoped that all of it would be put into practice by his followers and that it would become their yardstick, i.e. the way the health of one's Christian life is measured. Therefore, at least once in a lifetime, the study of this great teaching of Jesus cannot be avoided. This Course intends to give a refreshing, practical and in-depth view on the Sermon, reading the Message of the Lord in the unity of the entire Gospel of St Matthew.

Structure of the 3 days

The Course will follow the structure of the Sermon:

1st Saturday: Introduction: Understanding the meaning of the Sermon according to Saint Matthew, First part of Chapter 5, Second part of Chapter five: the Son.

2nd Saturday: Chapter 6: the Father. Praying.

3rd Saturday: Chapter 7: the Holy Spirit. Conclusion

Who might find the course useful?

Anyone would find explanations of the Greater Charter of Christianity interesting: people from all venues of life who want to understand how Christianity was understood by the first generations of Christians, people who want to deepen their Baptism, people who already have a spiritual life but want to give it Solid Foundations.

What content is covered?

- 1. How to implement the Baptismal Grace according to St Matthew.
- 2. The deep meaning of the purification of our heart brought by the Redemption of the Lord in Baptism.
- 3. Drawing power from the dynamic presence of the Trinity in our Life.
- 4. How to be "held" by the Father's Hands: the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- 5. How to enter into our "inner room" in order to pray.

Where and when does the course take place?

The course will take place at St Mary of the Angels, Moorhouse Road, Bayswater, London, W2 5DJ, Saturdays 5th, 12th and 19th of November 2016.

Who will the course be taught by?

The course will be taught by Jean Khoury, a theologian who has studied and taught Spiritual Life in the Church for over twenty years. As well as lecturing world-wide on spiritual life and meditation, Jean is the author of several books, articles and studies on spiritual life and the founder of the School of Mary, a 3 - level formation in the spiritual life (www.amorvincit.com). Jean obtained a degree in Philosophy from the Institut Catholique de Toulouse (France), a Licence in Theology from the Teresianum (Rome) and a Masters in Spiritual Theology from the Institut Catholique de Toulouse (France). He is currently completing his PhD in Spiritual

Theology at the Angelicum (Rome) with Monsignor François-Marie Léthel.

How much will the course cost?
